

# The Conversion of the Pentecostians

Acts 2:1-47

1. For what were the disciples waiting in Jerusalem (Acts 1:4, Luke 24:49)?
2. What was the enabling power for which the apostles waited?
3. What caused the multitude to come together?
4. Who would be saved when “that great and notable day of the Lord” comes?
5. What were four facts Peter gave in the opening words of his sermon (verses 22-24)?
6. The psalmist David is called in to witness that God had previously determined that a certain person would be raised from the dead. How does Peter prove that it is not David but Jesus of Nazareth?

7. Peter showed the Jews that Jesus had fulfilled every prophecy of David in Psalm 16 except the resurrection. How does he prove that in verse 32?

8. How does Peter prove that Jesus was exalted at the right hand of God in verse 33?

9. What did Peter say that caused belief of the facts he had presented, the most intense realization of guilt, and the most fearful anticipation of punishment?

10. What question did the Jews ask at the close of Peter's sermon and what did it mean?

11. What did Peter tell them to do to receive remission (or forgiveness) of sins?

12. Was that all that Peter told them (verse 40)?

13. How were they to "save themselves"?

14. How many were baptized?

15. Is there any evidence that the apostles had to be “re-baptized”?

16. To whom or what and how many were added that same day?

17. Did they join a church? (Be sure and get your answer from the Bible.)

18. What is described in verse 42, and what does it say about the results of Peter’s sermon?

19. What was the cause of the remarkable unity described in verses 43-47?

20. According to verse 47, where were the saved placed?

21. Were any unsaved added to the church? If not, why not?

22. Who added the saved to the church?

23. Why didn't they "join the church of their choice"?

24. Was this the "birthday" of the church?
